Gownfield Infant School: a wholechool approach

At Crownfield Infant School, Havering,
Landon, the project was set as half term
homework across the whole school. Pupils
From Reception through to year 2 were
whole to write about their experiences, to
make use of Google Earth and maps, add
their own photos and draw pictures to
capture the places that mattered to them
and how they had travelled there. These
places stretched from the local area to
rance and Dubai (Figure 4). The Subject
Lead told us that the pupils 'enjoyed
exploring maps and relating them to
their own personal geography'.

After half term, the parents really got involved and a display was created in the lead-up to World Book Day. The Subject lead told us: 'It was a good way to explore and discuss the history and diversity of our school's community as well as improving mapping skills'.
